Principles for efficient and fair cooperation of companies



Company cooperation for joint purchasing

Why?

to help facilitate access to the AggregateEU

for companies without sufficient demand, expertise or credit worthiness etc.

How?

voluntary and temporary nature respecting competition rules in the context of joint purchasing non-exclusive

When relevant?

At the time of finalising the contracts with suppliers responding to tenders on AggregateEu


Discarded:

Full consortium through establishment of a legal entity e.g. JV



Agent on-behalf model


- Buyers register at AggregateEU and aggregate demand at the platform
- Buyers may buy services onbehalf from Agents
- Buyers sign contracts with suppliers and Agents on-behalf perform the services they were paid for





Central Buyer model

- One gas company signs individual contracts with buyers
- CB negotiates and signs one contract with supplier(s) to satisfy demand of the buyers
- There might be many CBs not one
- CB operates either as a seller or as a buyer in the same tender





Some conditions

- Company can participate either as a seller or as a buyer in any single tender, but not both.
- The gas demand should be submitted to the AggregateEU platform
- Commercially sensitive information should only be exchanged bilaterally and this bilateral exchange should be limited to what is necessary
- The CB should **not derive rents on the commodity of gas**, but could earn rents for ancillary services (transport, balancing, negotiating etc.)
